Colorado Hunter Jumper Foundation (CHJF) is pleased to report that 2023 was another successful year. We continued to offer educational scholarships, provide achievement opportunities, and provide emergency financial support to individuals and families in the Colorado Hunter Jumper Community.

The work of CHJF is funded entirely by donations. We continued to receive donations for the victims of the Hidden Pines Fire. Our Silent Auction at the Colorado Hunter Jumper Association (CHJA) Awards Banquet was held in January. Under the leadership of Sarah Watson \$6400.00 was raised for Scholarships. We also received \$4000.00 from CHJA for the CHJA Spirit of Excellence Scholarships. Gold Crest Sport Horses, owned by Jenny Alsberg, made us the beneficiary of the 2024 Charity Challenge Horse Show, resulting in a donation of \$2480.00. Mountain King Ranch donated \$1000.00 to support Equitation Education. CHJF greatly appreciates all of our donors!

Due to the generous donations noted above, we were provided \$1240.00 in additional support to the Hidden Pines Fire Victims, donate \$600.00 to Rosie's Ranch for helmets, awarded \$14,000. in scholarships and provided equitation education at the CHJA Member Benefits Clinic.

The 2023 Kris McConnell Award, given to a CHJA Member for outstanding service to a charitable organization was presented to Christine Remy for her work at The Right Step. The 2024 Barb Arkin Award, given to the Junior CHJA member with the highest score on the Horsemanship Challenge written test at Medal Finals, went to Amelia Parsons.
